Dual Enrollment Vocabulary

Dual Enrollment	Student enrolled in a high school and college at the same time.
Dual Credit	College course earns both high school credit and college credit.
College Credit only	College course earns college credit only.
Part-time Dual Credit	Dual enrolled student with HCPS approval to be enrolled in high school courses part-time and enrolled in college courses part-time. The college courses meet the remaining high school requirements.
Senior Waiver	Dual enrolled student with HCPS approval to take only college courses.
Part-time College Credit only	Dual enrolled student with HCPS approval to be enrolled in college courses part-time. The college courses do not meet high school requirements and earn only college credit.

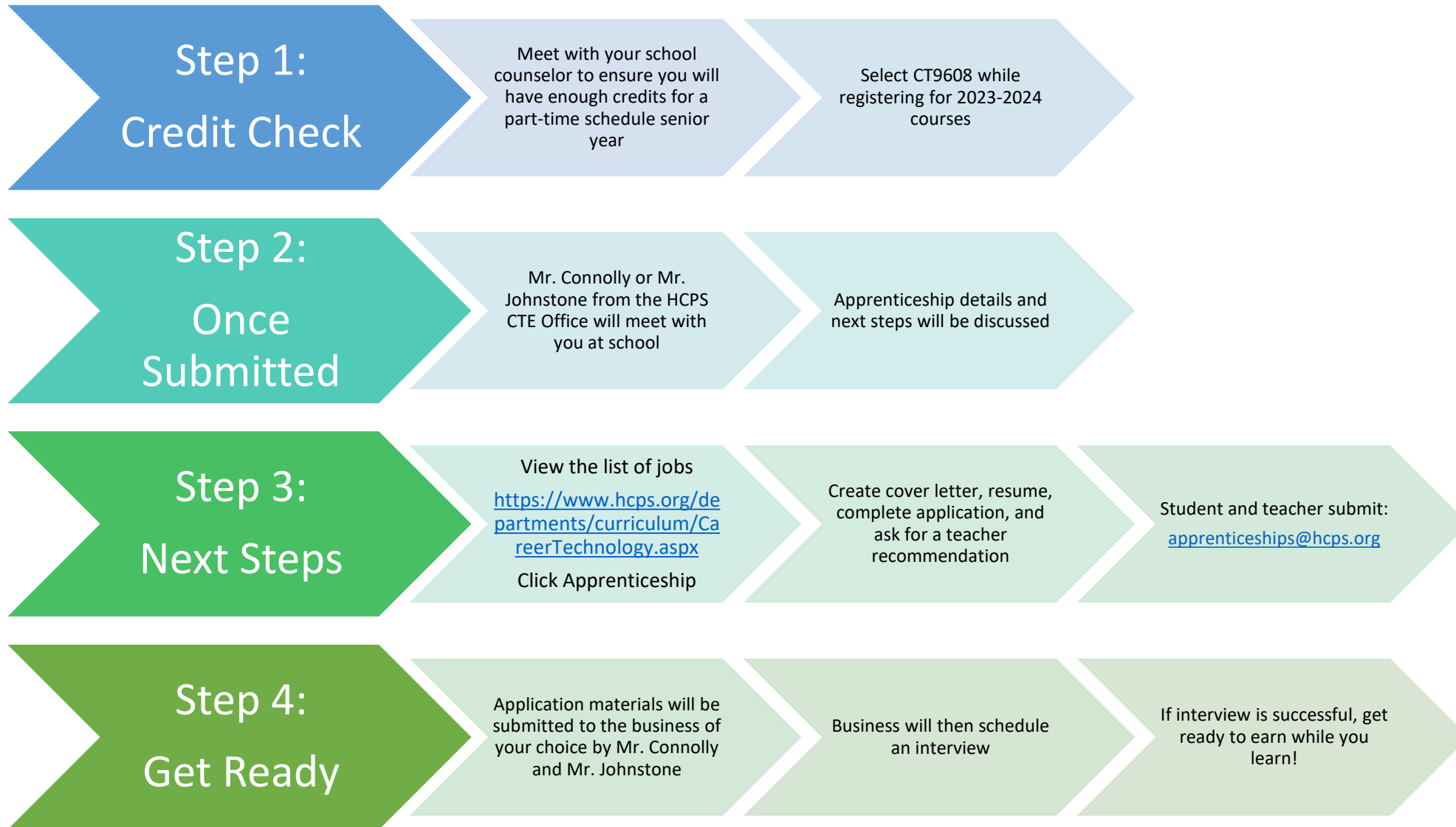
