


FYI...

- *In order to be approved to take HCC classes through SEO you must:
 - •Have 17 or less days absent from last year.
 - •Have a GPA that is above 2.0
 - •You must take all classes required for graduation at Bel Air High School (if denied for any of these reasons).
- *You CAN still apply for part time attendance in the SEO.
- *Make sure you are aware that if you take a college class, that is the beginning of your college transcript as you move on to a different college.
- *If approved through SEO for Dual ONLY, it WILL show on the high school and college transcript.
- *If you take a class at HCC and fail, HCPS will not pay for any more future classes.
- *The SEO application also serves at your HCC application if you are applying for Dual Enrollment.







Class Options: Cohort

- Students need permission from their high school counselor to participate.
- Classes that are selected by HCPS each semester.
- Offered in the high school or online during the school day
- Students are automatically registered for these classes

Class Options: Non-cohort

Students are taking HCC classes on-campus or online for high school graduation requirements or for early college credit. Your HCC recruiter can assist with registration.

Students may need to submit a recent high school transcript, send test scores (SAT, ACT), or take the Accuplacer to register, based on the course's prerequisites.

Students work with their HCC admissions representative to register for classes.

HOW TO GET STARTED

- 1. Talk to your HCPS counselor to determine if DE is an option for you
- 2. Complete SEO application in your Student Planner
- 3. When approved, you will be automatically accepted by HCC (we recommend that you apply early)
- 4. Students will receive an HCC acceptance letter via email
 - Emails are sent to the email address on your application
- 5. Student activate their HCC student accounts (OwlNet and OwlMail)
- 6. Non-cohort students contact your HCC Admissions Representative after March 15th Use Your OwlMail
- 7. Registration for the summer/fall semesters will open April 15th

- Students can earn hours junior year, summer leading into senior year, and senior year
